The Board of Equalization having been in session more than three days and less than twenty, and having disposed of all complaints relating to assessments that have been presented to them and it appearing that the state board of equalization were satisfied with the assessed valuation of Box Butte county, as returned by the county assessor, it further appears to the board that the total assessed valuation of the taxable property of Box Butte county, Nebraska, as made by the county assessor and returned by the state board of equalization and by them accepted, is \$1,777,375.00, now therefor it is the order of the board that there be levied on each dollar of assessed valuation of the property assessed in Box Butte county, for the ensuing year of 1910, the following tax, to-wit: County general fund 9 mills. County road fund, 1 1/2 mills. County bridge fund, 3 1/2 mills. Total 14 mills.

It is the further order of the board that for school, sinking fund, bonds, interest and high school purposes, (as reported to the county superintendent by the several school officials); to meet the payment thereof, that there be levied against the taxable property in each school district herein-after named, the rate of taxation on each dollar of assessed valuation in said districts, as follows, to-wit:
