



Speech of Hon.F.M. Broome

Below we give the speech delivered by Hon. F. M. Broome of Alliance on Oct. 12th, during the ceremony of laying the corner-stone for the new addition to St. Agnes' Academy.)

Experts estimate that the stored water from the Roosevelt reservoir has added more than one million dollars to the value This stored water amounted, in round figures to 200,000 acre thought, then I shall feel amply rewarded feet. That is, at the beginning of the season there was water in the reservoir sufficient to cover 200,000 acres to the depth of one foot.

The comparatively small amount of water that was stored was, of course, due to the fact that the dam last winter had not the more lowly, and on the other hand for reached a point high enough to store more than 200,000 acre feet.

Because of the uncompleted dam, a vast quantity of flood water went on its wasted

Thus it is seen that this year, notwith standing that but ONE-SEVENTH of the reservoir's capacity was used, the stored water has brought unexampled prosperity to the valley.
