drills. 2. Study of best American writers. 3. Discussions of latest and best text-books in reading. 4. Interpretative and appreciative study of selected masterpieces.

The work on reading will be based on Sherman and Reed's "Essentials of Teaching Reading."

Prof. J. C. Mitchell

Supt. J. C. Mitchell is a graduate of the Peru State Normal and of the University of Nebraska. He taught two years in country schools, three years as principal of village school at Eustis, Nebr., and three years as Superintendent of the schools at Friend, Nebr. During the present year Mr. Mitchell has been taking graduate work at the University of Nebraska. While Supt. Mitchell is a stranger to many of the teachers of this part of the state, he is well known in Nebraska educational circles.

Supt. G. E. Martin

Supt. G. E. Martin of Nebraska City is one of the ablest and best known of Nebraska educators. For eight years he has been identified with the Nebraska City schools as principal of the high school and as superintendent. He is joint author with J. W. Searson of the recently issued "Studies in Reading".



Prin. W. R. Pate.

Supt. Pate has been connected with the Junior Normals of the state for the last seven years, two at North Platte and five at Alliance. He was Principal of the Alliance Junior Normal last year and has been re-appointed to that position by State Supt. J. W. Crabtree.



Supt. C. N. Walton.

The teachers will be glad to know that Supt. C. N. Walton of Wahoo, Nebr., who was a member of the Alliance Junior Normal faculty when he was Superintendent at Chadron, Nebr., will be with us again this year. Supt. Walton is a graduate of the University of Nebraska, was principal of the High school at Auburn, city superintendent at Chadron, and is at present serving his fourth year as city superintendent of Wahoo, Nebr. His scholarship, experience and knowledge of western conditions will make him a valuable member of the faculty.



Registrar Della M. Reed.

Miss Della M. Reed, who will act as Registrar of the Alliance Junior Normal, is County Supt. of Box Butte county. Miss Reed was for several years one of the strongest of the Alliance teachers and was then promoted to the county superintendency. In addition to her duties as Registrar she will conduct the class in penmanship and drawing.



Preceptress Susie R. Frazier
