GERMAN LUTHERAN SCHOOL

To be Held in Drake Building, 517 Sweetwater Avenue

On August 28, two weeks from next Sunday, the German Lutheran parochial school will commence.

This school is to be, in the first place, a Christian school, in which the pupils will receive instruction in the Christian religion every day, and will be educated and trained to lead Christian lives.

In the second place, this is to be a German school, since children will here receive elementary instruction in the German language.

In the third place, this school is to be an English school, in which the English language and all branches taught in the public schools will be thoroughly taught.
