#### ST. AGNES ACADEMY

School Will Open on Tuesday, September 5th, With Bright Prospects

Tuesday, September 5th, is the day set for the opening of school at St. Agnes Academy. Tuesday is selected as the opening day instead of Monday in order that students from a distance may come on Monday and be present on the opening day.
