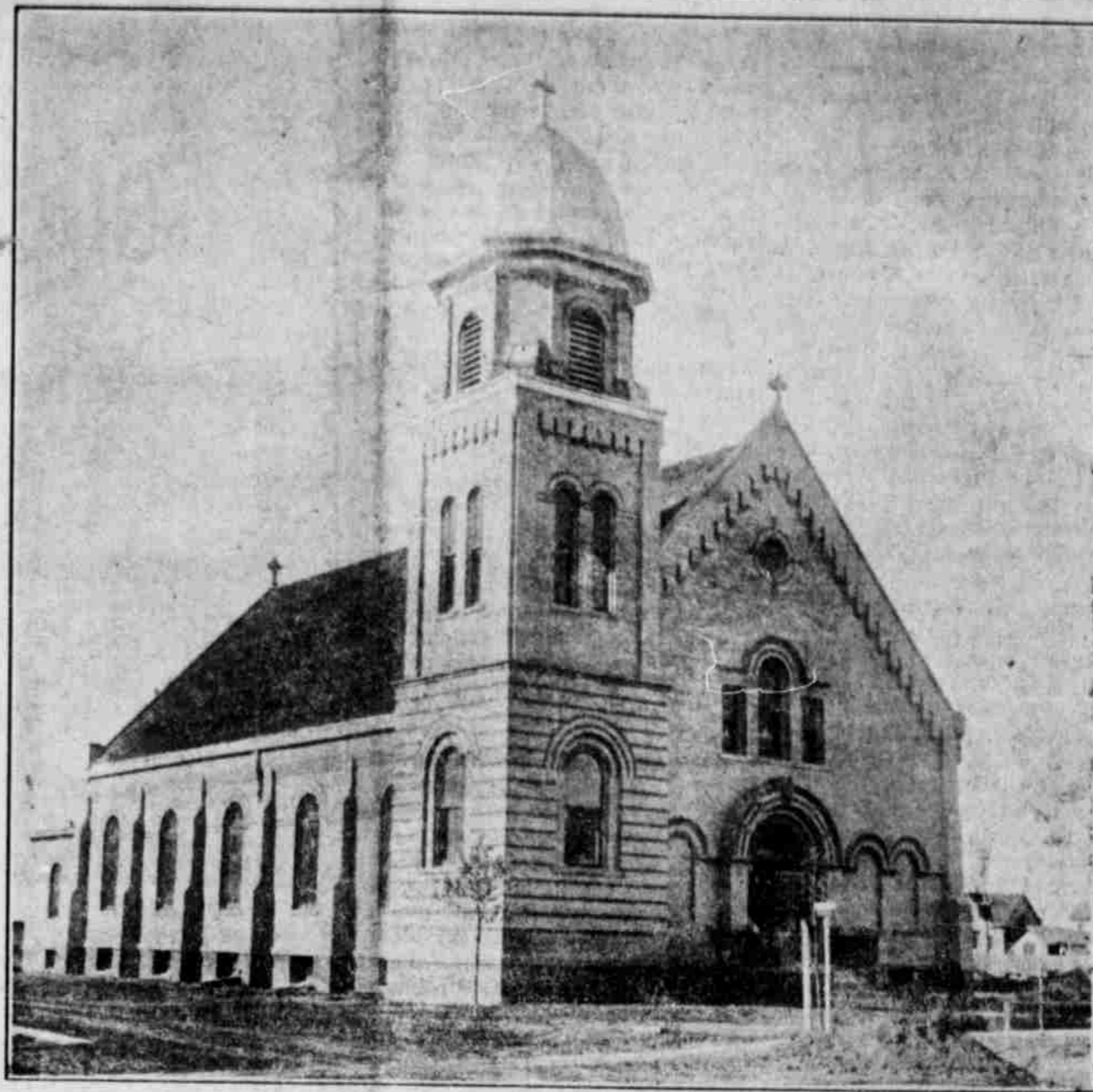

Yesterday was a red letter day for the Catholic church of Alliance. The magnificent new building, as shown in the cut which we are pleased to publish on this page of The Herald, was dedicated with appropriate services commencing at 9:00 o'clock in the morning, following which mass was said by Father Haley of Lexington, who was first resident pastor at Alliance. Father Haley was assisted by Father A. Herne of Omaha and Father Galvin of Spaulding, Nebraska, two of the old pastors of Alliance. Following mass Bishop Scannell preached a sermon that was listened to with intense interest by the large company present. Following morning services dinner was served by the ladies of the parish in the basement of the church from 11 to 1, and supper was served from 5 to 7 in the evening. Evening devotions began at 7:30 and consisted of a sermon by Father McGovern of Omaha, whose subject was "The Guarantee of Certainty in Christian Faith." The services
