FIRST ISSUE, MARCH 16, 1912

Yielding to repeated and urgent re quests to establish a daily newspaper in Alliance, The Herald Publishing Company has decided to make the experiment for one month, commencing Saturday, March 16, and continuing till Monday, April 15. The reason for selecting this particular period to try the venture one month is that, on account of the union revival meetings which are to be commenced next Sunday, a full account of which will be published in the daily, a large number of extra subscribers can be secured. We are planning to print one sermon com-

plete in each issue after the first. While the daily will give full account of these meetings, its news wil not be confined to them by any We will give the usual quota of local news, besides state and general news to some extent.

The daily will be strictly nonpartisan. If politics are discussed, it will be from an independent standpoint.

The Alliance Daily Herald will be published one calendar mont,h daily except Sunday, making twenty-slx ssues. The subscription price will be 5 cents per single copy, 15 cents per week, and 50 cents for the 'entire month. We will print some extra copies of the first issue so that persons who are unable to send us their subscriptions on or before Saturday of this week may have their subscriptions begin with the first isne, until the supply of extra copies

has been exhausted.
