OPENING DAY OF BIG CONVENTION

First Day of Stockmen's Convention Opens Under Favorable Conditions and with Good Prospects

INTERESTING DAILY PROGRAM

The big Stockmen's convention for 1912 is on. Beautiful weather, a program never before excelled in interesting features, important business to be transacted by the Nebraska Stock Growers Association, a large attendance, all add interest to this great annual event.

The attendance today is fairly good and it is expected that many more people will be in town Friday and Saturday than today. The South Omaha crowd, without whom the stockmen's convention at Alliance would never be quite complete, arrived this morning, as stated in another column where a list of their names is given.

Mr. Cooper, the aviator, is here, accompanied by his assistant. He made a trial flight before breakfast this morning in his Curtis biplane. It worked fine. He will make three flights this afternoon and also Friday and Saturday afternoons. 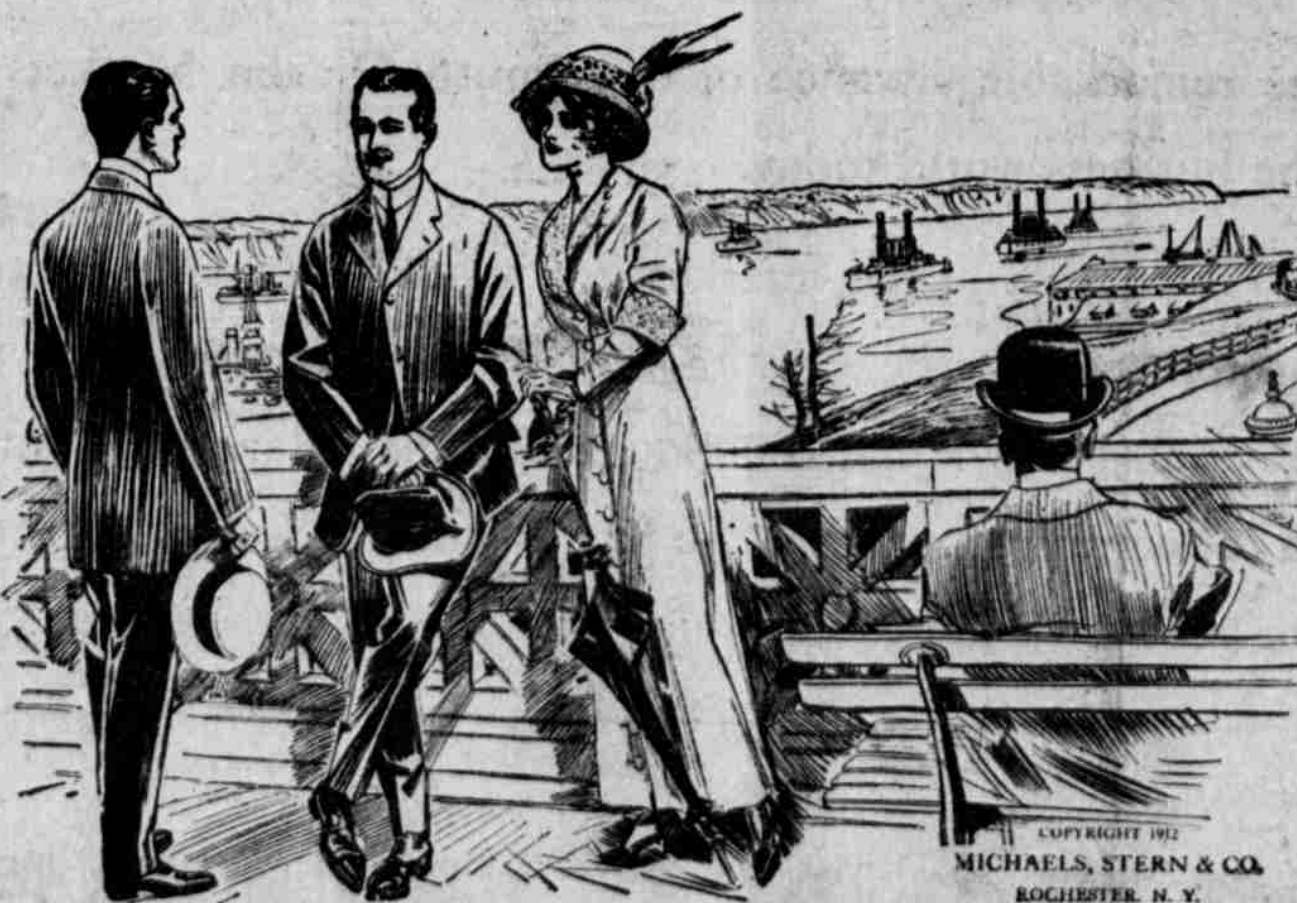
