NEBRASKA NEWS

More Money in the Treasury
Than for Some Time Past.

CAR OF GRANITE IS LOCATED.

Stone for the Lincoln Monument is Located in Kansas City—Employees of Penitentiary Discharged Because of Fight.

Lincoln, June 17.—That the finances of the state are picking up is evidenced by the fact that at the close of business Saturday, the treasury was \$43,000 to the good, as compared with \$18,000 the Saturday preceding and a month ago several thousand to the bad. The month of May and thus far in June the county treasurers of the state have been sending in their remittances and in consequence the state treasury is looming up on the right side of the ledger.

Car of Stone Found.

At last the lost is found. The last car of stone for the Lincoln monument has been found in Kansas City. Work has been delayed several weeks on account of the non-arrival of this identical car, and while it would seem to be pretty hard work to lose track of a carload of big granite, such is the fact and for more than two weeks the railway companies have been trying to locate the big blocks of stone, which left Quincy, Mass., weeks ago.

Higher Rate Granted.

The Burlington has received permission from the railway commission to make the higher Sioux City, Fremont, Omaha, Lincoln and Grand Island rates between points west of the Missouri river named in items \$450a, \$451a and \$452a, supplement 10 to tariff 5000a, applying to all commodities named in such tariffs, instead of being restricted to the ten classes and emigrant movables. This change will result in some reduction by reason of extending the tariff to all commodities.

Randall Distributes Cards.

State Fire Commissioner Randall has just received at this office 200,000 cards for distribution over the state. These cards contain matter which will tend to educate the people of the state along the lines of preventing fires by proper precautions. "An ounce of prevention is worth a whole ton of cure," said the commissioner in his emphatic way, "and if I can have my way there will be such a system that fires will be very few in the future."

Fight at the Penitentiary.

W. G. Cloyd, a penitentiary guard, and Night Engineer Frye of the same institution were discharged by Warden Melick on account of a fight which they had indulged in at the home of the latter. It is asserted that both men were drunk. Cloyd was arrested by the Lincoln police and later fined by Police Judge Fullerton.

Swift Labels Lard.

The Swift company has consented to label its lard and butter packages, in accordance with the wishes of Food Commissioner Hanson. The company has been using a small rubber stamp, which at times was unreadable, but now prints the net weight in large letters on all its lard and butter.

Irrigation Right Denied.

The board of irrigation has denied the right of J. H. Kernsenbrock of Columbus to use the waters of the west fork of the Blue river for irrigation purposes on the grounds that he had abandoned and not used his right to the water for more than ten years.

CHADRON RAISES PHONE RATE

Mutual Agreement With Business Men Regarding It.

Lincoln, June 17.—Application of the Chadron Telephone company to raise rates on business telephones from \$2 to \$2.50 has been granted by the railway commission on representation that there was a mutual agreement with the business men of the city regarding the rate.

Arguments in the Lexington matter were taken under advisement regarding the rights of the Union Pacific to compel passengers to get on and off of trains on the opposite side of the train from the depot when trains are on the outside track of the double system at that place.

Petitions are coming in to the railway commission in opposition to the raise of rates of the Lincoln Telephone and Telegraph company in Johnson county. Crab Orchard sent in a petition of 114 names and Grant one with sixty three names. O. R. Schumann and J. F. Anderson of Grant called also to protest in person.

Tecumseh Ministers Threatened.

Tecumseh, Neb., June 17.—Two preachers at Table Rock, Revs. Wimberly and Young, have been notified by letter that unless they discontinue their fight on the saloon they will be shot.

Golden Wedding at Weeping Water.

Weeping Water, Neb., June 17.—Mr. and Mrs. James Colbest of this city celebrated their golden wedding anniversary. About 250 guests called and the maids brought many letters of congratulation.

Boone County Pioneer Dies.

Albion, Neb., June 17.—John Peters vice president of the First National bank of this city, died after a long period of poor health.

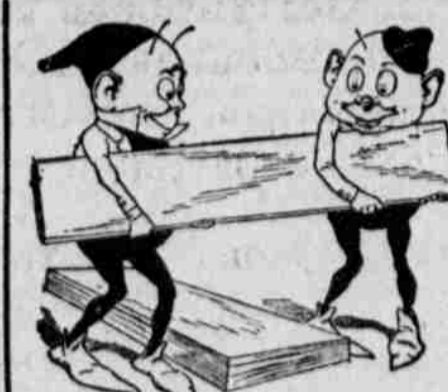
