REAR END COLLISION

That there is a Higher Power who is caring for the railroad men was clearly demonstrated last Sunday morning when a double header in a blinding snow storm struck a waycar in which there were two men. An extra went with eighty cars, Conductor Frank Roberts, Rear Brakeman Ray Hoag, engine 5038, Engineer Scharver and Fireman John Willis were in the sag between Berea and Hemingford. Owing to the blinding storm and slippery rails they were moving slowly. At 6:30 a. m. they were struck by a double header, Conductor Dick Keener, Engineer Frank Wilson, engine 5016, Engineer Elmer Johnston, engine 3106, with Firemen Nichol and Ambrose. Engineer Wilson saw the tall lights in time to set the air and whistle signals. All of the engine men jumped except Fireman Ambrose, who was putting in coal. The smoke box of the head engine was run up in the way car. The car took fire but was put out, by some hard work on the part of the men, before much damage was done. Only two cars ahead of the waycar were derailed. Some of the engine men were scratched and bruised up but no one was seriously hurt. The main line was blocked about three hours. ***
