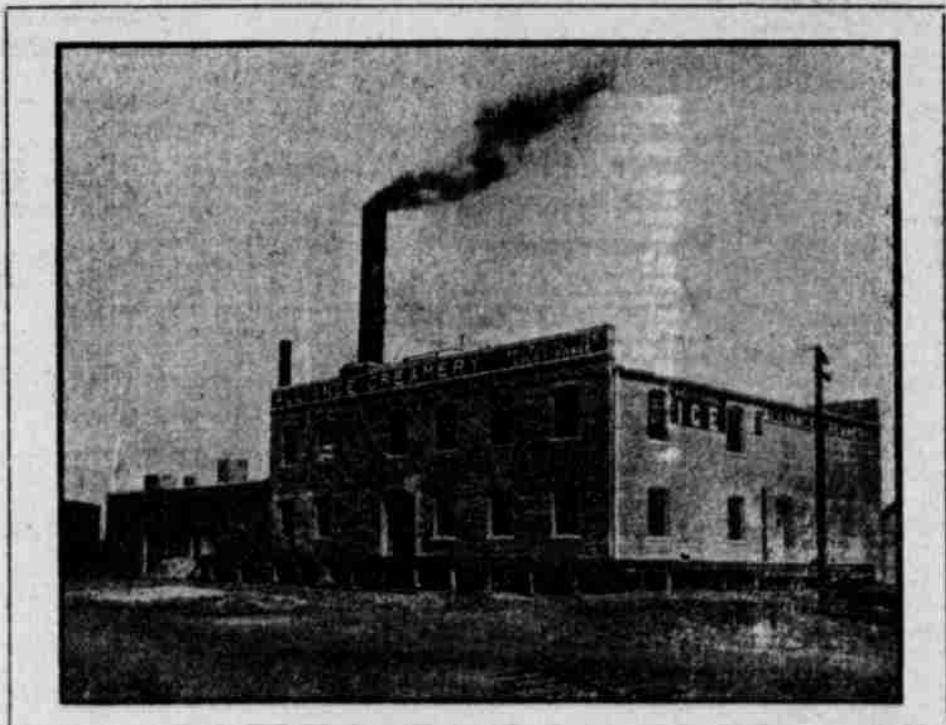

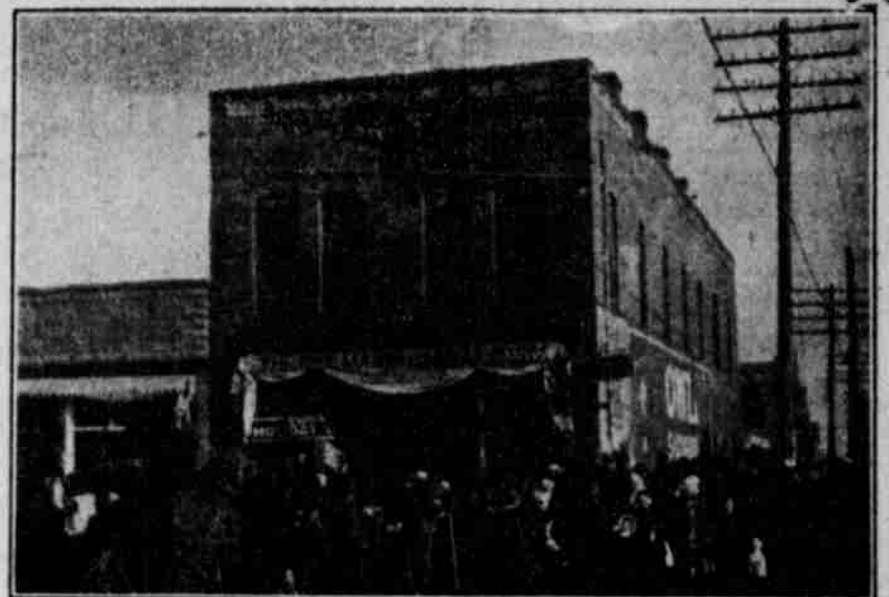
#### MRS. W. W. NORTON ENTERTAINS
