Ordinance No. 190
An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor of the City of Alliance on behalf of said city to accept offers made to the city by certain citizens of said city to pay for the cost of the material for the installation of an ornamental post lighting system in said city and to bind said city to maintain said system, for ten years and furnish current for use and consumption in it for ten years.

Whereas, certain property owners and tenants of the city of Alliance have heretofore affixed their signature to a purported agreement between property owners and tenants covering the installation of an ornamental post lighting system and each has offered to give the amount set opposite his name to defray the cost of purchasing the necessary material for the installation of said system.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Alliance, Nebraska,

Section 1. That the Mayor of said city is hereby authorized on behalf of said city to accept the offers above set out and he is hereby authorized to bind the city of Alliance to install and maintain said system for a period of not to exceed ten years and to furnish current for use and consumption in said system for a period of not to exceed ten years.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication according to law.

COURT HOUSE NEWS

The petition of Louis Lariviere vs the Burlington, which was filed in district court on February 15th, has been answered. The petition alleges that on June 7, 1912, Lariviere fell into an open ditch on a railroad crossing at Crawford, that the ditch was not protected by lights or in any other manner, and that his back, side and stomach were wrenched, bruised and injured. He asks damages in the sum of \$2,399.00. The Burlington's answer was filed on 9-23-13 and summarily dismissed in the petition are admitted. The rest are denied.

COMMISSIONERS' PROCEEDINGS

Alliance, Nebr., March 10, 1913.
The Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment. Officers present: S. C. Reek, chairman, C. L. Hashman, and J. M. Wanek.

Upon advice of the County Attorney and an opinion of the Supreme Court of Nebraska, filed Jan. 16th, 1913, the surety bond of the First State Bank of Hemingford, Nebraska, as surety for county funds on deposit, is hereby released by the Board, and the clerk is hereby ordered to return the bond on file to First State Bank, Hemingford, Nebraska.

Bids on file for the purchase of Court House Bonds were opened by the board, but no action taken, except looking into financial standing of bidders.

The balance of day was spent in going over road petitions with tax payers present.

Whereupon the board adjourned until tomorrow morning, March 11th, at 9 o'clock.

The board viewed road in Wright precinct for which there is on file a petition to vacate, and after viewing same refused to order said road vacated.

The following proceedings were had and done, to-wit:

Be it remembered that on the 12th day of March, 1913, the matter of establishing a road No. 50, coming on to be heard before the commissioners, upon the petition, report of commissioner, approval of notice to said land owners, claim for damages and appraisers report; and the board being fully advised in said premises, IT IS ORDERED that the said road be established as prayed for in the petition as to that part commencing at the southwest corner of Sec. 35 and running thence north one-half mile between Sections 34 and 35 all in Township 25 North, Range 47 West, that the width of same be 66 feet; that the same be opened as required by law.

It is the further order of the board that the claim for damages be allowed as per appraisers' reports, and the clerk is hereby ordered to draw warrant for the same.
There being nothing further to come before the Board at this time, they adjourned to meet March 18th, 1913, at meeting of Precinct Assessors.
