The following article was printed regarding Alliance and Post M in the special edition of the Omaha Trade Exhibit of April 13th, issued for the Nebraska Division of the T. P. A.:

Alliance, a bustling little city of 5,000 people, is situated at a strategic point, the center of the panhandle of Nebraska. It is a division and general division point on the Burlington and the terminus of the Denver and Gurneys lines of that road. It is noted for its live business men, its large number of traveling men, who are members of recently organized T. P. A. Post M, and the fact that it is the business center of the western end of the great state of Nebraska.

Post M of the Traveler's Protective Association, was organized on Saturday, March 1st. State officers and directors present at the organization meeting were S. S. English, president; H. A. Dunkin, second vice president; Chas. L. Hopper, secretary-treasurer; Geo. E. Begerow, chairman board of directors; and Frank B. Holbrook, director. Starting with thirty members at organization, this flourishing post now has fifty-six members, only a month later.

The officers of Post M are R. C. Strong, president; Frank Hertzog, vice president; John H. Hawes, secretary-treasurer; Dean Geo. G. Ware, chaplain; C. E. Slagle, M. D., physician; board of directors, S. W. Thompson, chairman, J. C. Berry, C. L. Ewing, H. C. Redenbaugh, W. M. Baker; legislative committee, C. A. Newberry, chairman; railroad committee, C. O. Bagley, chairman; press committee, Lloyd C. Thomas, chairman; hotel committee, Joseph F. O'Connor, chairman; employment committee, C. J. Vandever, chairman; good roads and public utilities committee, Ivan Rodgers, chairman.

The delegates who have been elected to attend the state convention at Kearney this month are: A. D. Rodgers, Lloyd C. Thomas, C. L. Ewing, S. W. Thompson, C. A. Stapleton and R. W. Lubbers, together with President Strong and Secretary Hawes. Alternates elected are: J. C. Berry, Joseph F. O'Connor, Ivan Rodgers, Lincoln Lowry, Gus Appleburg and C. A. Newberry.

Alliance is a healthy place in which to live. Its altitude is 3,942 feet. It has two large public school buildings and one large school building, recently burned, is to be rebuilt this summer. St. Agnes Academy offers full courses of instruction. Alliance has a number of first-class hotels; municipal waterworks and electric light system; modern sewer system; very fine telephone system installed the first of March at a cost of \$40,000; cannery which manufactures over 500,000 pounds of butter per year; several wholesale houses; a live business men's association of which A. D. Rodgers, mayor-elect and a member of Post M, is president; two live newspapers; two national banks, with a capital and surplus of \$200,000 and deposits of more than a million dollars; one of the finest passenger depots in the state, costing nearly \$100,000; many churches; forty fraternal lodges and labor societies; several social clubs; Box Butte County Fair association with grounds and buildings valued at \$10,000; large stock yards; several miles of cement walks; United States land office for western Nebraska; \$75,000 appropriated recently for erecting a federal building on a site which was purchased two years ago at a cost of \$15,000; \$65,000 in bonds voted at a recent election for the purpose of building a new court house; and over 1,000 children of school age in the city.

Alliance was 25 years old on the 25th day of February. Its birthday was fittingly celebrated by a monster banquet held in the opera house, at which old-timers made interesting speeches and a general old-time get-together feast was enjoyed.

Box Butte county, of which Alliance is the county seat, contains 30 townships and has a population of nearly 10,000. There are 56 school districts in the county. The chief crops are potatoes, of which a carload was sent for Omaha tornado relief, and small grain. The population of the county is rapidly increasing by the influx of new settlers who are breaking up the raw prairie and raising big crops from the virgin soil.
