which has 400 members, has as its object the protection of its members and to promote the live stock industry. The Association aids in prosecuting those who steal cattle and horses from its members

A record is kept of all brands of the different members and all cattle shipped to the markets of South Omaha, Chicago, Kansas City, St. Joe, Denver and Sioux City are inspected by the inspectors of the Wyoming Stock Growers' Association, for which service this Association pays to the Wyoming Association the sum of \$4,000.00 per annum. For the year ending March 31, 1912, there were inspected at the South Omaha Yards alone 10,826 cars of Nebraska cattle, numbering 274,309 head. The inspector made out and transmitted to the Secretary of this Association 5,144 reports covering these shipments. The proceeds of 426 head were taken by the inspectors for members of this Association and sent to the Secretary. There was sent to owners by the commission houses at the request of the inspectors the proceeds of 1,570 head. The total of all strays taken for members of this Association is 2,052 head, amounting to \$83,169.20.

This Association holds membership in the American National Live Stock Association, the aim and object of which Association is the taking up of matters before the legislatures, courts, etc., that would be of advantage to stock raisers throughout the country.
