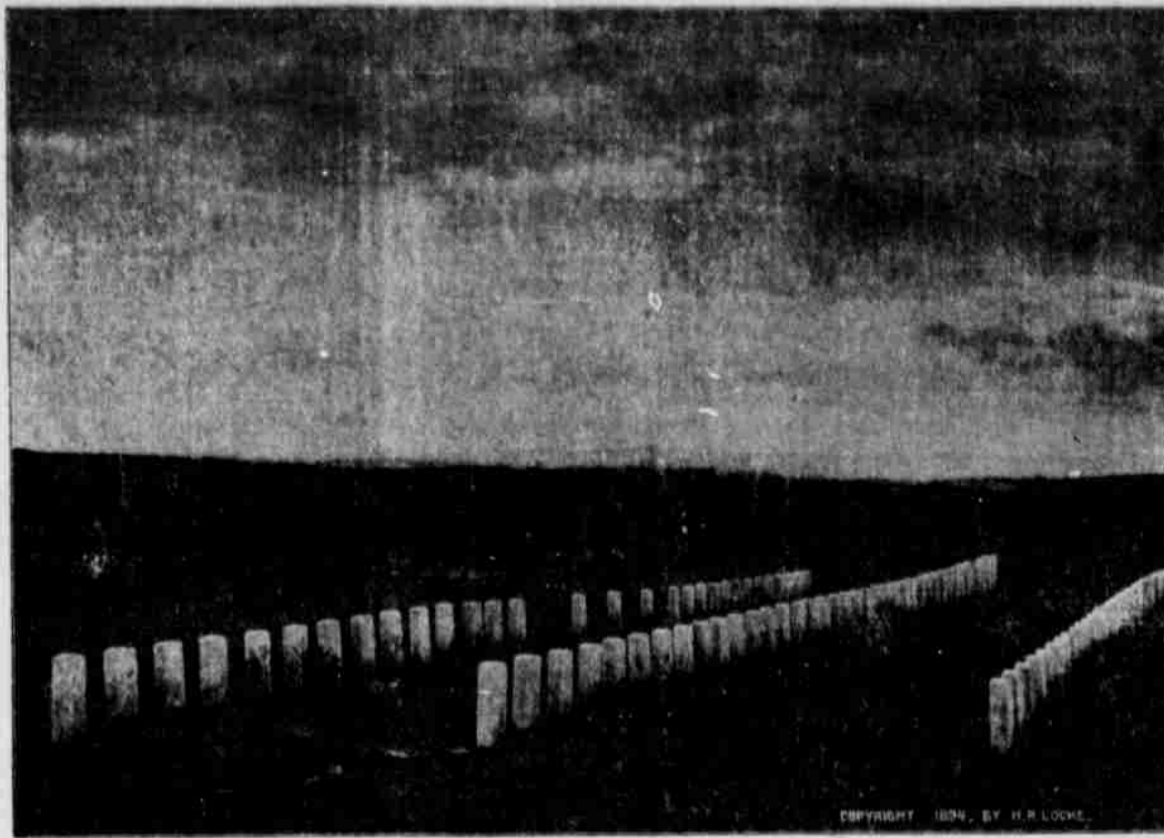

The Custer Battle Field

Above is the scene of the Custer massacre on June 18, 1876, in which Custer and every one of his faithful men were killed by the Sioux Indians on the Little Big Horn river in South Dakota. "Curly the Crow", the only survivor of this world famous battle, who was a government scout at the time, is in Alliance and will deliver an interesting address at the Crystal theatre Saturday evening, telling of the big battle and of his other thrilling experiences during his ten years of service for the government.

Perfecting Patents

I. U. Hager, who has been in Washington, D.C., for the last five weeks, working on his two patents, has returned to the city. Mr. Hager, with his associates, has invented a kerosene and distillate dry gas producer which will, if it fulfills the

hopes of its inventor and those who have seen it, make kerosene and distillate take the place of gasoline, as far as gas engines are concerned. It will be adaptable to all kinds of gas engines, both in autos and in stationary engines. It is claimed that it will make a gallon of kerosene or distillate go as far as one and one-third gallons of gasoline, the

kerosene only costing about half what the gasoline does. Mr. Hager also has invented an automatic oil regulator for oil burning locomotives and engines that burn oil for fuel. This regulator shuts down the amount of oil fed when the steam pressure gets too heavy and lets in more oil when the steam pressure gets light.

The United States Civil Service Commission has announced competitive examinations to be held in Nebraska at Alliance, Grand Island, Lincoln, Nebraska City, Norfolk, North Platte and Omaha, on the dates named below.
