



The London force is composed of the most well-balanced, prudent and consid-


erate men, and yet they carry their point and uphold the law in a thousand cases, when the bluecoats in the United States would deem it necessary to use their clubs.


Instead of haling a very drunken man to the station, one of our bobbies will call a cab, if the incbriated one is at all gentlemanly looking, and send him to his home or hotel.
