

Starting Wednesday, October 1st the Alliance postoffice force, as well as those all over the United States. began weighing and counting all packages which are sent by parcel post. In addition to weighing and counting, they must keep an accurate record of the mail received from the different zones and to what zones it is sent.

The purpose of this test is to ascertain whether or not the carriers and railroads are now hauling more weight than before. If this should be the case the amount of compensation received by the carriers and the railroads will be increased in proportion to the increase made in the amount of mail carried.

Although it necessitates a great amount of extra work, the Alliance postoffice force will handle it without extra help.
