TO LAY CORNER STONE

EVENT IN TWO WEEKS

The county commissioners in session Wednesday granted permission to the Alliance Lodge No. 168, I. O. O. F., to lay the corner stone for the new court house. The committee of Odd Fellows who conferred with the commissioners was Link Lowry, John Snyder and Lloyd C. Thomas.

Edgar Martin, county treasurer, is a prominent Odd Fellow and was the first to suggest that the laying of the stone be done with proper ceremonies.

The date for the laying of the stone has not yet been set, but

will probably be two weeks from next Saturday, in the afternoon. Impressive ceremonies will be used and a large crowd from all over the county is expected to attend.

The stone will have a hollow space inside 4 1-2x10 1-2x5 inches, in which a sealed copper box will be placed. In the copper box will be documents, coins and any other relics which those who are present desire to see preserved in the stone. The stone will be two feet by two feet six inches in size.

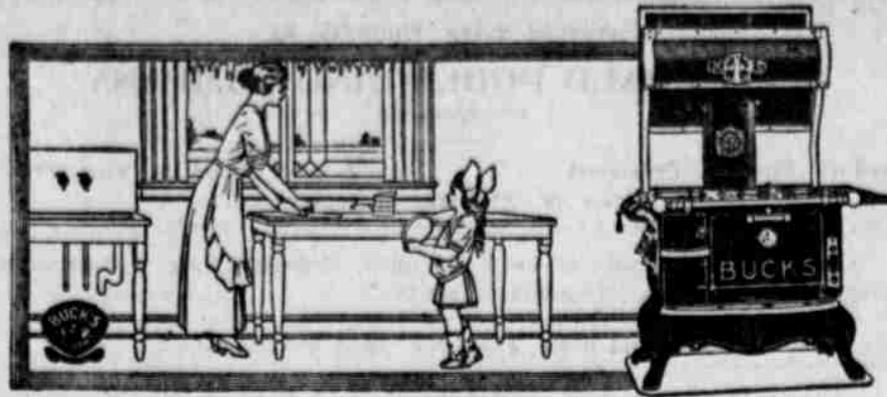
