FOOTBALL SEASON OPENS

New Eleven Will Be Ready for Games by Nov. 5—All Corners Accepted by Team—Lineup

That Alliance will have one of the best football elevens in western Nebraska seems evident from the present outlook. The team is now being lined up and expects to be ready for the first game not later than the 5th of November.

Men who are candidates for the eleven are: Francis Lowry, Clarence Schaffer, Carl Spacht, Charles Spacht, F. J. Carter, Frank Klausson, George Nation, Cecil Smith, Harold Snyder, Ross Hull, Ward Hall, "Cyclone" Trabert, Graham, Dwight Zediker, Ben Freshley, Steele, and "Dutch" Maunier.

Some of these men were on the old team of 1905, '07 and '08. They played at that time, Spacht, center; Klausson, guard; Carter, guard; Hull fullback; Hill, left half.

Men who were on the Alliance school eleven are: Spacht, half back; Schaffer, quarter. Lowry comes from the Baptist college at Grand Island, eleven of 1907. This was a very strong team and played the Alliance team here.

There are an abundance of line men in the list of candidates but the team will be hard up for back field men. Johnny King and Charley Hill will be coaches. Both are experienced men.

The lineup will probably be, according to those who are posted: back field—Nation, Hull, Lowry and Charley Spacht. Quarterback—Hall and Schaffer. Ends—Dwight Zediker and Cecil Smith. The line will average 184 pounds in weight. The men state that they will go any place and play any team for railroad fare and hotel expenses. There will probably be fourteen men on the team.

An application for a game has already been received from the Fort Robinson team. The following letter was received from the manager of that team:
