## Commissioners' Proceedings

Minutes of Recent Meetings of County Commissioners Furnished by County Clerk

Alliance, Nebr., Nov. 28, 1913. The Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment. Officers present, S. C. Reck, chairman, C. L. Hashman, and J. M. Wanek.

This meeting was called for the purpose of conferring with representatives of furniture houses relative to furniture for the new court house.

The day was spent in going over lists of furniture needed for the different offices in the new building.

Whereupon the board adjourned until tomorrow morning, Nov. 29, 1913, at 9 o'clock.

Alliance, Nebr., Nov. 29, 1913. The Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment. Officers present, S. C. Reck, chairman, C. L. Hashman, and J. M. Wanek.

After considering the lists of furniture prepared on Nov. 28th, 1913, and making some changes, the lists were submitted to the several furniture representatives present, with the understanding that they would have blue prints and specifications of same prepared to be submitted to the board at a later date, without cost to the county.

Whereupon the board adjourned, to meet at the call of the clerk.

Alliance, Nebr., Dec. 9, 1913. The Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to the call of the clerk. Officers present, S. C. Reck, chairman, C. L. Hashman, and J. M. Wanek.

This meeting was called for the purpose of conferring with T. L. McGerry, representative of the National Fidelity and Casualty Company, said company being the surety on the bond of R. A. Matthews, contractor for the new court house.

Some time was spent in going over the condition of the various contracts entered into by R. A. Matthews.

Whereupon the board adjourned until tomorrow morning, December 10th, 1913, at 9 o'clock.

Alliance, Nebr., Dec. 10, 1913. The Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment. Officers present, S. C. Reck, C. L. Hashman, and J. M. Wanek.

Mr. T. L. McGerry, representative of the National Fidelity and Casualty Company of Omaha, Nebr., explained the present condition of the Court House contract to the board and a number of tax payers present, and made request that work on the new court house be discontinued for three months.

No official action was taken by the board on this request and the matter was left to the bond company to fulfill the contract of R. A. Matthews as they had been heretofore notified.

Whereupon the board adjourned until tomorrow morning, December 11th, 1913, at 9 o'clock.

County Treasurer Martin reported on hand in the Bridge Fund \$300, Automobile Fund \$237, and Poll Tax \$253, a total of \$790, and same is ordered transferred to the Road Fund.
