Confiscated Much Liquor

Scottsbluff, Nebr., June 25—To the music of hymns by a crowd of several hundred people, who had been attending a chautauqua, Sheriff Aoran and Chief of Police Guernsey emptied nineteen barrels of beer and a large quantity of whiskey into the sewer.

The incident was one feature of a movement by business men and officers to clean out bootleggers. Seven Mexicans and Greeks have been arrested. Four were found guilty in the district court and fined from \$400 to \$550 each. Fet Fekeris, "King of the Greeks" and S. G. Reis, "King of the Mexicans," were two who were sentenced.
