PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. ONE.
The following proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, as hereinafter set forth in full, is submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska to be voted upon at the general election to be held Tuesday, November 3rd, A. D. 1914.

"FOR A Joint resolution to amend section 1 of Article 9 of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, relating to revenue. Be It Resolved and Enacted by the People of Nebraska: Section 1. That Section 1 of Article 9 of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska be amended to read as follows: Sec. 1. The rules of taxation shall be uniform as to any given class and taxes shall be levied upon such property as the Legislature shall prescribe. Taxes may also be imposed on incomes, privileges and occupations, which taxes may be graduated and progressive and reasonable exemptions may be provided, in addition to those hereinafter specifically mentioned in section 2 of this article.

Sec. 2. That at the general election in November, 1914, there shall be submitted to the electors of the state for their approval or rejection the foregoing proposed amendment to the Constitution in the following form: "For amendment to the Constitution providing for uniform and progressive taxation and reasonable exemptions for uniform and progressive taxation."

Approved, March 27, 1913. Addison Wait, Secretary of State, of the State of Nebraska, do hereby certify that the foregoing proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Nebraska is a true and correct copy of the original enrolled in and approved by the Legislature of the State of Nebraska, as amended, and that said proposed amendment is submitted to the qualified voters of the State of Nebraska for their adoption or rejection at the general election to be held on Tuesday, the 3rd day of November, A. D. 1914.
