### Ordinance No. 198

An ordinance appropriating funds to defray the expenses of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the fiscal year ending on the first Tuesday in May, 1915, and levying a tax for the payment of the general and incidental expenses of said city; a tax for the support and maintenance of the public library of said city; a tax for the maintenance and repair of the sewer system of said city and taxes to pay the interest and the principal upon the water bonds, water extension bonds, sewer bonds, light bonds, City Hall bonds and City Park bonds of said city.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLIANCE, NEBRASKA:

SECTION I. That there is hereby appropriated out of the money to be raised by tax or otherwise by the City of Alliance, Nebraska, the sum of \$30630.00, for the purpose of paying the general and incidental expenses of said City; for supporting and maintaining the public library of said city, for maintaining and repairing the sewer system of said city, for paying the annual interest and creating a sinking fund for the payment of the principal on the water bonds, water extension bonds, sewer bonds, light bonds, City Hall bonds and City Park bonds of the said City in funds as follows:

Fire and water	5000
Stationary and printing	500
Street and city light	4000
Public library maintenance	1300
Sewer maintenance	1500
Water bonds	3000
Water extension bonds	1000

City Park bonds	250
Total	\$30630

SECTION II. That there is hereby levied a tax of ten mills on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the payment of the general and incidental expenses of the City of Alliance, Nebraska.

SECTION III. That there is hereby levied a tax of two mills on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the purpose of supporting and maintaining a public library in the City of Alliance, Nebraska.

SECTION IV. That there is hereby levied a tax of one mill on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the maintenance and repair of the sewer system of the City of Alliance, Nebraska.

SECTION V. That there is hereby levied a tax of six mills on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the purpose of paying the principal and interest on the water bonds of the City of Alliance, Nebraska.

SECTION VI. That there is hereby levied a tax of two mills on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the purpose of paying the interest and principal on the water extension bonds of the City of Alliance, Nebraska.

SECTION VII. That there is hereby levied a tax of four mills on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the purpose of paying the principal and interest on the sewer bonds of the City of Alliance, Nebraska.

SECTION VIII. That there is hereby levied a tax of two mills on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the purpose of paying the principal and interest on the lighting bonds of the City of Alliance, Nebraska.

SECTION IX. That there is hereby levied a tax of one mill on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the purpose of paying the interest and principal of the City Hall bonds of the City of Alliance, Nebraska.

SECTION X. That there is hereby levied a tax of one mill on each dollar of the assessed property valuation of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, for the purpose of paying the principal and interest on the City Park bonds of the City of Alliance, Nebraska.

SECTION XI. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication, according to law.

### Firestone Tires in War Service

Just before the Mexican war cloud darkened the horizon of the U. S. War Department, General Lucio Blanco, commanding the Constitutional forces in Mexico, drove his war car through the thickest of the Matamoros battle. This car was equipped with Firestone Non-Skid tires. The tires were badly mutilated by the hail of bullets from the Federal sharpshooters, but the tough fabric was not penetrated, although a ball from one of the machine guns cut a broad gash in one of the treads. General Blanco gave the tires credit for carrying him safely out of the danger zone.

Later, when it seemed that Uncle Sam must invade Mexico, a report of the part these tires played in the above scrimmage came to the ears of Capt. Alfred Aloe, depot quartermaster of the U. S. Army in Galveston. He immediately got in touch with the Firestone Company and, although he did not want pneumatic tires because of the danger of puncture, he ordered Firestone solid tires with quick detachable rims. This equipment made it possible to change a tire in a few minutes when necessary.

This led to other departments taking up the matter, and at the present time Firestone Tires have become widely distributed in the U. S. Army service.

Now comes the report that Russia has a number of their army trucks equipped with Firestones. It seems that some time ago, a Gramm truck was shipped to St. Petersburg on a chance, when the report came that the Russian War Department was in the market for motor equipment.
