

Why Alliance Needs a Community Building

Probably one of the most prominent questions which the people of Alliance are now discussing is the erection of a Community Building. which could be used by all citizens. young and old.

Some people are opposed to this plan, saying that the city has no time. need for any more public buildings. The while others feel the necessity of such a place where they could spend their spare time in reading or recreation.

Country people, when in town, would have a place to deposit their bundles and to rest when they are wearied by the drive to town, and this will help to create a better friendship among the people of Box Butte county.

The men of the country and town could have access to the club room, swimming tank and gymnasium, also to the reading room.

The young people, especially, will enjoy going to this proposed building, and are now in favor of it, and working. Many mothers and fathers sometimes do not know where their young folks go after school. Probably they are loafing around the streets, or hanging around the pool halls, wasting both time and money. If they have access to Community Building, they could spend their time in clean and wholesome recreation, and thus prevent much of the degrading pastimes. It would also, by gymnasium work, enable students to obtain greater physical strength and exercise their muscles.

Nearly all of the High school students are back of this proposition and are eager for a building which would be of great value to them.
