J. P. Barger, Box Butte County Tree Expert, Favors Making Good Use of Melting Snow  
J. P. Barger, the Box Butte county tree expert, who is making a success

of raising trees here by the use of dynamite in preparing the ground, and whose advertisement appears in this issue of The Herald, says that the farmers of the county could make good use of the present melting snow by practicing irrigation in a crude form.

He says that if dynamite was used to break up the ground for practically all crops, and then small irrigation ditches made to direct the water from the melting snow onto the ground which had been prepared, the moisture would be of great benefit in the growing season. Mr. Barger makes a low charge for the work of dynamiting larger areas and he has the facts and figures to prove his contention that it is a good thing.
