This is only the freight, and the majority of butter, eggs and poultry are shipped by express. This shows that there is quite a little business being done here, even if we have not gotten a depot yet.

### COMM CLUB—BOX HEAD

Commercial Clubs of West Nebraska. A meeting was held in Alliance last week at which time the Commercial Club organizations in the eleven counties in western Nebraska in the panhandle district organized the Associated Commercial Clubs of Western Nebraska. Delegates were present from Sidney, Crawford, Chadron and Hemingford. The purpose of the organization is co-operation in the upbuilding of western Nebraska, and Secretary Fisher of Alliance was the prime factor in this movement. — Omaha Commercial Club Journal.

The Kewanee Commercial Club is conducting a special ten days cleaning up and paint up campaign, and they have received the hearty co-operation of the different school boards, the women's organizations and every civic board in the city.

The Des Moines Commercial Club just recently adopted the same plan as put into effect by the Alliance Commercial Club over a year ago, preventing fake charitable organizations from soliciting their members unless same have been indorsed by the charitable committee of their organization. This shows that Alliance is more up to date than some of the larger cities.

Alliance will entertain three conventions in June. The State Sheriffs' Convention, the State Stockmen Convention and the District Christian Endeavor Convention. A big delegation will go to Hastings April 16 to try to secure the T. P. A. convention for 1916. The Alliance Commercial Club is co-operating with the traveling men and up to date over one hundred letters have been sent out in the interest of this convention.
