The necessary arrangements have been made, and while it is not yet an assured fact, it is very probable that the first well will be put down on C. L. Powell's place, three files north of town. Vance Successful Bidder for known that there are surer places than this, especially in the Snake creek valley, the Powell location is more advantageous as it will "prove" the territory in which it is located and is in a territory where irrigation is needed more.

Before it is declared a success, the well must furnish 200 gallons a minute for a considerable length of time. In case the first well is a success, the second one will be put in a place where indications are less sure, in order that it may all be tested. If the well is a success, it will be immediately transferred to the ownership of the farmer on whose place it is put. If it is not a success, it costs the farmer nothing, and it is not considered that there is a farmer in the country, who, if a good well was found on his place, would not willingly pay the costs.

C. A. Newberry will furnish the machinery for the wells, so that but little expense will have to be borne by the county.
