
#### State Engineer Will Save \$75,000 Annually by New Type Bridges -40 Tons of Auto Plates

(By Special Correspondent) Lincoln, Nebr., September 22-State Engineer Johnson has a new plan to save Nebraska \$75,000 annually. This plan has been put into operation since Mr. Johnson took charge of his department last aJnuary. On the North Platte bridge, which is 700 feet long, a saving of clean heat, at a nominal cost. nearly \$10,000 was accomplished. The automobile department of the office of Secretary of State Charles W. Pool will move into new quarters in the basement of the State House within a short time. These plates come in packages containing 100 each, the packages weighing about 125 pounds. The to-tal number to be stored in December, ready for use the first of January, will consequently weigh more than forty tons. Of nearly four thousand foreign






