Nebraska Primary Election Returns

Returns so far from state show Neville nominated for governor on Democratic side and close race between McKelvie and Sutton on Republican side. In Box Butte county Democrats nominate Cox for sheriff, Manion for clerk, Mollring for treasurer, Dillon for assessor and Westover for attorney. Republicans nominate Barnes for sheriff, Mounts for clerk, Irish for treasurer, Keegan for assessor and Basye for attorney. Thomas and Harper for representative.

Tuesday's election was the most hotly contested over the state since the primaries were adopted as the method of bringing out candidates for state office. At this time, Thursday afternoon, many offices are still in doubt and it will probably take the official counts in many counties to settle the matter. The unofficial count of Box Butte county is given below. The official count will be held Friday. Some additional mail ballots are expected but they are not expected to change any of the general results.

A special dispatch to The Herald Thursday afternoon gives the following count:

The vote on state senator from the 28th district is still in doubt although Porter of Crawford appears to have the lead. Griswold of Gordon is a close contestant.

Late returns on state representative from the 73rd district, comprised of Sheridan and Box Butte counties, show Lloyd Thomas in the lead on the Democratic ticket by 186 votes, and W. R. Harper on the Republican ticket by 40 votes. This poll includes all of Box Butte county and the north end of Sheridan county, including Rushville, Hay Springs and Gordon.

Charles H. Tully of Alliance may be the Democratic national convention delegate from the Sixth district. His vote in Box Butte county was 359. Incomplete returns show him to have a strong majority

in this end of the district, and he may carry enough in the east end to pull through. Frank J. Taylor will undoubtedly be the other delegate from this district.

Joe W. Leedom of Gordon, Republican candidate for commissioner of public lands and buildings, is making a strong showing, and while he will probably lose out in the east end of the state to Fred Beckmann, Leedom has placed his name before the people in a way that shows he is recognized and that may place him in line again.

In Box Butte county on the Democratic ticket John J. Manion was nominated for county clerk, Fred Mollring for treasurer, Cal Cox for sheriff, Opal Russell for county superintendent, P. H. Dillon for county assessor, and Joe L. Westover for county attorney. On the Republican ticket W. C. Mounts was nominated for county clerk, Frank W. Irish for treasurer, W. O. Barnes for sheriff, Mary Robertson for superintendent, J. A. Keegan for assessor and Lee Basye for attorney.

On the non-partisan ticket W. H. Westover and Edwin D. Crites were nominated for district judge, and Ira E. Tash and L. A. Berry for county judge, by a vote of 498 to 273.

Charles H. Tully of Alliance is making a good race for delegate to Democratic national convention. Porter of Crawford and Griswold of Gordon running neck and neck for Republican nomination for state senator from 28th district. Official count to be held on Friday. Mail ballots may make slight but probably not important changes. Complicated ballots cause slow voting and still slower counting. Vote over state and in Alliance largest ever polled at primary.
