Cooling Tanks

Keeping the cream cool is one of the essentials for producing good butter, says the College of Agriculture. Tho the farmer may see to it that cows, stable, milker, utensils and separator are clean, and the creamery may take every care of the cream, bacteria will multiply rapidly and spoil it if it is not kept cool. For this reason, a cooling tank within the reach of the farmer is necessary. Such a tank has been devised by College of Agriculture experts and butter manufacturers. It is a circular, well-insulated tank. Well water introduced near the bottom does the cooling. Specifications for this tank may be obtained from the dairy husbandry department of the College of Agriculture, Lincoln.

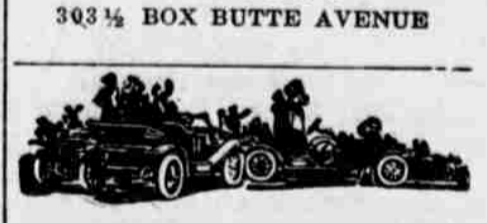
