Pacumonia Strikes Down the Young and Old Alike-Strictly Cold Weather Ailment

This section has been a surprisngly large number of cases of La drippe and Pneumonia this winter. Some have the idea that pneumonia a disease exclusively of the aged. out this belief is erroneous accordng to Dr. C. F. Chapman, head of he department of health for the city f Lincoln. He presents figures to show that probably one-third of the deaths from this source strike between the ages of ten and fifty years. This strictly cold weather ailment is described as being invariably a germ affliction. The primary cause of pneimonia is said to be generally some other disease or diseases. Principal among these is said to be influenza. Dr. Chapman has just issued the following bulletin on pneumonia:

Ten per cent of all the deaths in the United States result from pneumonia. Seventy per cent of all cases cear between December 1 and May 1.It is distinctly a cold weather infection. Pneumonia prneipally affects those at the extremes of lfe, but no age is exempt.
