First Presbyterian Church Represented at Christian Endeavor Convention at Bridgeport

At the twelfth district Christian Endeavor convention held at Bridgeport last week Miss Vera Spencer of Alliance was elected superintendent of junior work. J. H. Vance was elected to head the citizenship department; and Mrs. Edna Wiltsey of Hemingford to head the Quiet Hour.

The convention is reported to have been one of the most inspiring ever held by the United Societies of Christian Endeavor of the twelfth district. An exceptionally good program was

rendered and a particular effort made to entertain the twenty-seven out-of-town delegates in attendance.

The First Presbyterian church of Bridgeport was represented at the Alliance convention last week by Beulah Reddish, Esther Nation and Nina Nation. Mrs. W. E. Spencer went along as chaperon.

On one of the evenings the citizens of Bridgeport took their cars and tendered a picnic supper to the delegates at Court House Rock.

Special features of the convention were the "Quiet Hour" talks each morning by Rev. J. B. Brown of Gordon the Junior conference by Miss Grace Hooper; the model business meeting; the address by Rev. T. J. Brown of Hemingford on "Early Experiences in Nebraska among the Indians." Mr. Brown gave one of the most interesting talks that the Endeavorers ever heard of the life among the various tribes of Indians in all

parts of Nebraska. He grew up among them, came to Nebraska in 1860 and has lived and labored in the state ever since. Rev. Samuel Light, D.D., spoke to the convention on the subject of the summer conference at Henry. Rev. Thos. K. Hunter, D.D., of Kimball, gave the closing address, on "Making the Goal."

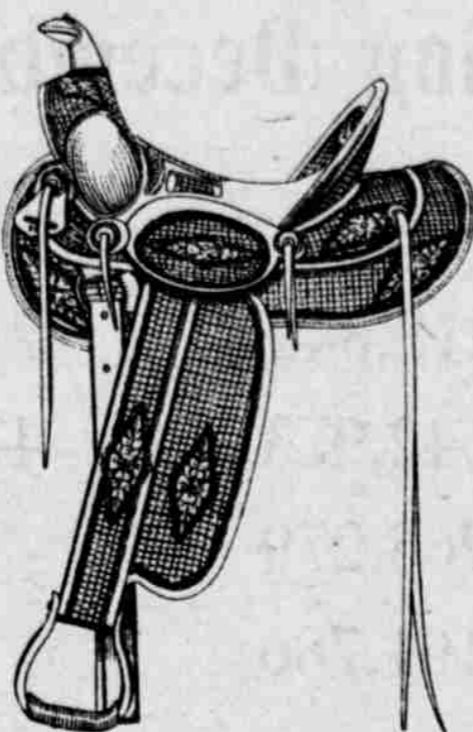

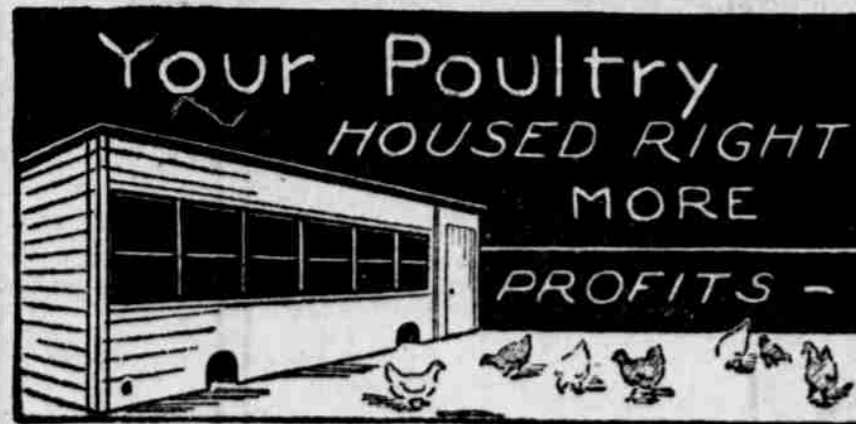
