USE GOOD JAR RUBBERS

If canned fruits and vegetables are to keep safely thru the winter, rubber rings of good quality must be used on the glass jars. If these are of poor quality (and the rubbers on the market this season are said to be of poorer quality than ever before), the food may spoil. Most good rubbers will stretch and return promptly to place without suffering a change of inside diameter or breaking, the certain satisfactory new brands of rubbers will not stand this test until after boiling. They must be reasonably firm and able to stand bending without breaking. They must also be able to endure sterilization in boiling water.
