Peru State Normal Notes

President D. W. Hayes left Saturday, June 29, for the National Educational association at Pittsburg, to which meeting he is the Nebraska director.

Chautauqua week is offering a full and interesting program combining entertainment, inspiration, information. Good weather and good crowds.

Miss Anna Tibbits is studying in Columbia this summer.

Miss Ethelyn Dewey, teacher in the training school, has gone to her home at Janesville, Ia., to spend the summer with her parents.

Miss Lou Ella Hosmer has completed her work in the summer school and will spend her time doing work in Chicago university.

J. G. Masters, principal of the Omaha high school and summer school faculty member at Peru, gave a lucid and forceful chapel talk the other day on the subject "Some Signs of Progress in the New Democracy." Our only regret was that the chapel period was so short.

Peru and the summer school are to have the opportunity of listening to Dr. James Sullivan, sent out by the National Security league of New York City. Dr. Sullivan is state historian and director of the division of archives and history of the university of the state of New York. He was formerly principal of the Boys' high school in Brooklyn for some ten years and previous to that taught in the summer school of that institution, Cornell, Columbia and New York university. He studied for several years in Europe, being a student at the Ecole des Chartes in the University of Paris, at the University of Berlin, and also studied in Oxford, Munich, Vienne and Rome. He was in Europe when the present war broke out. He has written texts on the government of New York state and the history of England, and contributed various articles to periodicals and encyclopedias on history and political science. He is to address us on some subject connected with patriotism and the war.

Dr. Sullivan will be in Peru July 10, 11 and 12.

Clyde B. Moore, class of 1909, teacher of psychology in the state normal school, LaCrosse, Wisconsin, visited Peru last week in the interest of the chautauqua assembly.

Dr. J. Harold Williams, '08, from Whittier, California, was a welcome visitor one day last week. He was en route to Fairbault, Minn., where he is to conduct research work along psychological lines in the summer school at that place. Both he and Mr. Moore spoke in chapel.

The summer school students made a fine offering for the purchase of books for boys in service, this offering amounting to \$69.61.

Some fifty women students attending the summer school have asked for Red Cross sewing during July. Classes are being arranged for.

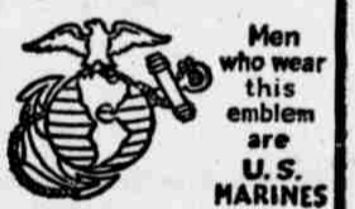
