Desirable Boevas Steady, Medium Kinds 10-15c Lower

HOGS STEADY 10 10c LOWER

Bulk of Sales, \$17.00@17.20 and Top at \$17.45—Heavy Run of Sheep Forces Declines of a Quarter—Few Sold by Noon.

Union Stock Yards, South Omaha, Neb., July 16, 1918.—Cattle receipts were very heavy, estimated early at 7,800 head, which is around 3,000 heavier than the corresponding Monday a year ago, and 1,500 larger than last week. Quality was very poor, there being but a few desirable cornfeds on sale, which sold at prices fully steady with last week, quotable from \$17.50@18.20 on the good to choice kinds. Medium grades of beef was 10@15c lower, and trade slow. Butcher stock was anywhere from slow and barely steady on dry lot cows and heifers to 25c lower on the medium grassy kinds.

Quotations on cattle: Good to choice heaves, \$17.50@18.20; fair to good heaves, \$15.25@17.00; common to fair heaves, \$12.00@14.50; good to choice yearlings, \$16.00@17.50; fair to choice yearlings, \$12.50@15.50; common to fair yearlings, \$9.00@11.00; good to choice cows, \$10.50@13.00; good to choice heifers, \$11.00@13.25; fair to good cows, \$8.25@10.25; cutters, \$8.00@8.50; canners, \$7.25@8.00; veal calves, \$8.00@13.50; bologna bulls, \$8.00@9.00; beef bulls, \$9.50@12.00; prime feeders, \$12.50@18.10; good to choice feeders, \$11.00@12.50; fair to good feeders, \$9.00@11.00; good to choice stockers, \$9.50@11.50; fair to good stockers, \$8.00@9.00; common to fair grades, \$6.50@8.00; stock heifers, \$7.50@9.00; stock cows, \$7.00@8.00.

Hogs Steady to 10c Lower.
Receipts were moderate, numbering 10,500 head, and although the market opened with a weaker tendency and price 5@10c lower than last week's close, trade firmed up, the bulk of the sales being from \$17.00@17.20, with a top of \$17.45.

Lambs Slow and 25c Lower.
Around 10,300 head of sheep were estimated early Monday, as compared with 6,500 head yarded last Monday, and trade was very slow and it was well along toward noon before the market was established. Best western lambs sold at a 25c decline, being quotable from \$17.00@18.00, and from \$14.50@17.00 on the fair to good kind. Yearlings sold at a spread of \$12.75@14.00, and fat ewes from \$10.00@11.75.


