Union Stockyards, Omaha, Aug. 14 .- The "Big" interests over played the "hammoring" game last week, and the supply of cattle this week have been cut in two, which together with the general rains caused a quick reaction from last week's decline. The packers want all the fat steers, weighing 1000 lbs. and over they can handle, and will pay good prices for these all of the time. The light and medium grades, when the quality and condition are not good enough for the feeders suffer most when supplies are heavy, and with such a wide range in prices, our readers should use more caution than usual.

The food administration has removed all restrictions regarding "beefiess days," and have urged the home demand to use more of the light beef, all of which will help the markets. The financial branch of the government has also given orders to render all assistance possible to live stock producers and feeders so there should be less of the premature marketing of young and breeding stock, and very little, if any, forced liqui-
