# Precautions in

In These Times it is Imperative That You Uuse Every Precaution In Storing Coal

Large quantities of soft coal are being stored by mercantile establishments and industries because of the fear of a fuel shortage during the winter. The danger of spontaneous combustion in this causes a serious fire hazard, and unusual care should be exercised by the owners of such 3 properties. The hazard can be reduced by proper selection of the grades and sizes of soft coal, and the exercise of proper precautions in its handling and storage.

Where large quantities of soft coal are stored in the open it should be in separate piles, so that a fire starting

will not spread through the entire supply, and the affected pile can be Storing Much Coal extinguished or moved. Where the coal is stored in basements the Fuel Administration suggests' the following precautions:


