Cattle 10-25c Lower Than Friday and Slow

HOGS FROM 15 TO 50c LOWER

Sheep and Lambs in Liberal Supply and Slow Sale.—25c Lower Than the Close of Last Week.

Union Stock Yards, South Omaha, March 25.—There was a fair run of cattle for a Monday, 7,800 head, and with bad reports from Eastern markets the local trade was slow with prices 10 to 25c lower than last week on both beef steers and cow stuff. Best beefs brought \$17.85. Stockers and feeders were generally steady.

Hogs 20@40c Lower. With a heavy run of hogs, 18,000 head and bad reports from the outside, the market was very slow in opening at a 15@25c decline and closed fully 35@50c lower than Saturday. Tops brought \$19.20 and bulk of the trading was at \$18.00@19.00.

A 25@50c Break on Lambs. A fair run of sheep lambs, about 11,000, showed up Monday, and they sold very slowly at prices ranging from 25@50c lower than the close of last week. Best lambs here brought \$19.80 and good feeder lambs sold at \$18.40@18.50.
