Union Stock Yards, South Omaha, Neb., April 15, 1919.—The available supply of cattle arriving Monday, 4,500 head, smaller by fifty per cent than arrived last Monday, and 8,000 less than arrived this Monday a year ago. Trading was slow and while best yearlings and handy corn-fed sold at strong prices, plain short feds and medium weight steers were weak and 10@25c lower, with some unsold at the noon hour. Top steers reached \$18.00, and a string of pulpers sold at \$16.25. Butcher stock was uneven, but about steady, best cows reaching \$14.00. Choice feeders on a strong market sold up to \$14.65.
