Ordinance No. 261
An Ordinance creating and defining the boundaries of Sewer District No. 38 of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, and repealing Sections three and four of Ordinance No. 256 of said city, and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith.
Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Alliance, Nebraska:
Section 1. That Sewer District No. 38 is hereby created in the City of Alliance, Nebraska.
Section 2. That Sewer District No. 38 shall include all real estate in Blocks twenty-three (23) and twenty-four (24) Box Butte Addition to the City of Alliance, Nebraska, Blocks S and T of Sheridan Addition to the City of Alliance, Nebraska, the North half of (N 1/2) of Lot one (1) and Lots nine (9) to fourteen (14) inclusive, Block V, Sheridan Addition to the City of Alliance, Nebraska, and Lot one (1) Block one (1), Hitchcock, Hill, and Snedeker's Addition to the City of Alliance, Nebraska, together with the intervening alleys.
Section 3. That sections three (3) and four (4) of ordinance No. 256, and all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
Section 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage, approval, and publication according to law.

Ordinance No. 262.
An ordinance providing for the construction of sanitary sewers forthwith in sewer district No. 37 within the city of Alliance, Nebraska, and providing for the assessment of the cost thereof to the abutting lands and lots.
Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Alliance, Nebraska:
Section 1. That sanitary sewers be constructed forthwith within sewer district No. 37 in the City of Al-

liance, Nebraska, without cost to the city.
Section 2. That upon the completion of the construction of said sewers, the cost thereof be assessed against the property abutting upon the streets, avenues, or alleys, or parts thereof, within which such sewer main has been placed, in accordance with the provisions of the statutes of the State of Nebraska.
Section 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication according to law.
