

### SILVER MINE COMPANY

Former Antioch Potash Magnate Leads Large Silver Mine Syndicate to Re-Open Old Colorado Mines.

L. F. Hulen, former Antioch potash magnate, is the head of a new \$2,500,000 Colorado corporation, just formed for the purpose of re-opening silver mines in that state. In Hinsdale county, Colorado, considerable interest is being shown in the re-opening of some of the silver properties that made that section famous. Probably none will be watched with more interest than the Golden Fleece, four miles up the Lake Fork from Lake City.

In the early seventies a surveyor, Ecos Hotchkiss, strolled from the camp by the shore of Lake San Cristoval up a gulch to the west and failed to find the source of this, which was one of the highest forms of tellurium with gold and silver, and later sold his claim for a trifling amount. Considerable prospecting was done before the real deposit was found—then something around \$3,000,000, of which about two-thirds was silver, was pulled out before a depth of 300 feet was reached, and the Golden Fleece was counted one of Colorado's bonanzas.

One day a round of shots that usually means a thousand dollars or more showed an entirely different formation and, as was discovered later, the ore shoot had faulted, and nothing but a coarse aggregate appeared. Work stopped. The U. S. geological survey made an investigation of the workings.

Last September L. F. Hulen, secured a lease and option on the Fleece and began an effort to find the old bonanza and to work the thousands of tons of low grade ores of the dumps. He rebuilt the old mill and installed the latest appliances for treating by table concentration and oil flotation methods.

The result so far have been of such a nature that a corporation capitalized at \$2,500,000 has taken over the proposition of the Golden Fleece and in addition, the Hind electric power plant.

Plans are already complete for development of all holdings on a large scale by a board of directors composed of Colorado and Nebraska business men. Among the Denver directors are L. F. Hulen, B. B. Snyder, J. D. Mallon, F. A. Slade, A. B. Sanford, R. M. Shearer and W. H. Lawrence.

Large stores of material and supplies have been ordered. A complete local electric light and telephone equipment is already on the ground, and a large warehouse purchased a large interest in a Colorado Alliance people have recently purchased silver mine and expect to profit handsomely by their investment.

### SPUD GROWERS SHOULD WATCH FOR DISEASE

Department of Agriculture Warns Growers to Beware of Disease Which Might Cause Trouble.

Western Nebraska has in the past been practically free of serious potato diseases. It can be kept so by carefulness and watchfulness of the growers. Potato wart causes very serious losses in England, Ireland, and other parts of Europe. In some places the disease is so severe that potatoes can not be grown profitably. The parasite which causes wart is spread most frequently by using diseased potatoes for seed. Soil once infested remains contaminated for many years. Prompt steps should be taken to stamp out the disease wherever found. Keep watch for warty potatoes at digging time and report all suspicious cases. Box Butte county so far has been entirely free from this disease, which is one of the most dangerous diseases of Irish potatoes and which has been discovered in some parts of the United States. Rough, spongy outgrowths of varying size are produced on the tubers, especially at the eyes. These warts are light brown at first, but become black and decayed with age. Sometimes all potatoes in affected hills are worthless. The disease does not attack the vines above ground.

### Sugar From Raisins.

Sugar is manufactured from raisins in practically all of the countries of southern Europe and western Asia. There are two forms of raisin sugar imported into New York, one principally from Asia Minor and the other mainly from Spain.

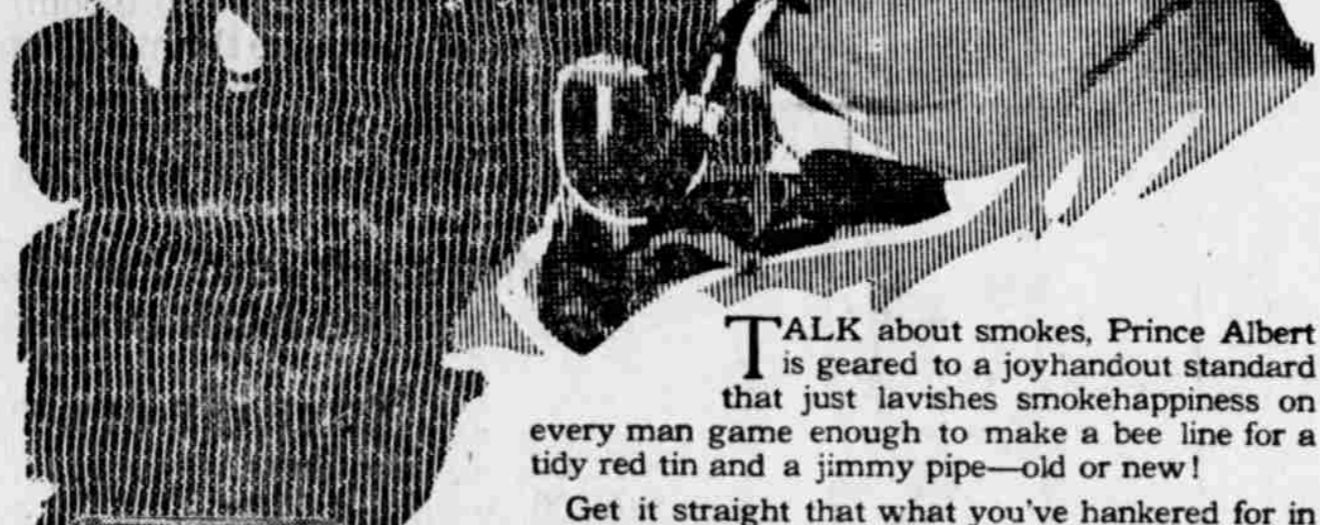
