

LIVESTOCK PRICES AT SOUTH OMAHA

Beef Rules Stronger Feeder Tone Better; Light Run

HOGS AGAIN ADVANCE

Values 25c-50c Higher Than Saturday — Top \$13.65 — Lamb Run Moderate and Market Generally Steady.

Union Stock Yards, South Omaha, October 28, 1919.—The week opens out with the cattle run even smaller than last Monday's estimates calling for only 13,000 head. Quite a sprinkling of native beef was on offer but the demand was good and offerings cleared at steady to slightly higher prices. Best short-feds brought \$15.00@16.80. Western beef were scarce and sold stronger. Demand for butcher stock was broad and prices were mostly 15c@25c higher than last week. Improvement was noted in the tone of the feeder trade and values were generally steady to strong, some of the good cattle selling 25c higher.

Hog values continued the advance which started the latter part of last week. Receipts were light only 3,700 head being on offer and the market was active at a 25c@50c upturn. Bulk sold at the rather wide spread of \$12.60@13.35 and the top reached \$13.65. Improvement in the shipping outlet was an outstanding feature.

With a moderate run of around 20,000 head, sheep and lambs of all classes moved on a generally steady basis. Best fat lambs were topped at \$14.25@14.50, with comebacks at \$14.00 and under. Quotable top on feeders is \$12.75.
