At next November's elections, unless the amendment to the federal constitution is ratified, the women may vote for president and vice president and most of the county officers, but they will have no voice in the selection of the following: United States senator, congressman, governor, lieutenant governor, secretary of state, auditor of public accounts, state treasurer, attorney general, state superintendent of public instruction, commission of public lands and buildings, members of the railway commission, members of the state legislature, judges of the supreme court, judges of the district court, justices of the peace and police magistrates. Neither will they have a vote on delegates to the constitutional convention or any question proposed by or submitted to the electorate of the state under the initiative and referendum. Outside of these few offices, their vote is as good as anybody's.
