**RECRUITING NOTES**

Some important "dope" has been received this week at the local recruiting office concerning special assignments. Men may now be accepted for service with any one of seven divisions comprising twenty-six infantry regiments. A man enlisted under this authority will be sent to his organization direct, but having once decided to serve in one place his assignment will not be changed. The following is the list as it was received by wire at the recruiting office: First division, Camp Taylor, Ky., Sixteenth, Eighteenth, Twenty-sixth and Twenty-eighth infantry regiments. Second division, Camp Travis, Tex., Ninth and Twenty-fifth infantry regiments. Third division, Camp Pike, Ark., Fourth, Seventh, Thirtieth and Thirty-eighth infantry regiments. Fourth division, Camp Dodge, Ia., Thirty-ninth, Forty-seventh, Fiftyeighth and Fifty-ninth infantry regiments. Fifth division, Camp Gordon, Ga., Sixtieth, Sixty-first, Sixth and Eleventh infantry regiments. Sixth division, Camp Grant, Ill., Fifty-first, Fifty-second, Fifty-third and Fifty-fourth infantry regiments. Seventh division, Camp Funston, Kan., Fifty-fifth, Fifty-sixth, Sixty-third and Sixty-fourth infantry regiments. For previous service men the enlistment period is one year and an absolute guarantee that you will serve in the outfit that you sign for at this office.

Another telegram received at the recruiting office to the effect that one-year enlistments for the signal corps school at Camp Vail, N. J., will close within the next two weeks is considered to be of great importance as there are a great many fellows in Alliance and vicinity that have expressed themselves as being interested. Never before in the history of recruiting has the signal corps been open as this particular branch has always been filled by transfer. It is, therefore, easily seen why this branch should be filled so quickly. There will be just enough men accepted to complete one more class and from this time it will be necessary to enlist in some other branch of the service and take a chance on transferring.
