 booming. Now the figures show that the center of population has moved a long way eastward, and that with the exception of a few extra good places, such as Alliance, the western towns are losing population while the eastern factory towns are

making big gains. One favorable sign, however, is that there are some ten million more individual farmers in the country than the count showed ten years ago.
 Farms are like factories in some respects, but unlike them, there is a limit to the size which can be handled efficiently and supervised economically. Several times there have been attempts to run big plantations on the factory plan, but fortunately the results have been sufficiently disastrous to put a stop to the efforts. Nothing shows the fallacy of such a forecast better than the census figures and it's worth something to know definitely that the middle class is not only prosperous, but increasing.
