**ORDINANCE NO. 285**

An Ordinance providing for an inspection of sewer connections within the City of Alliance, Nebraska; providing for a certificate of inspection thereof; providing a fee for such inspection; prohibiting the use of such sewer connections prior to the issuance of such certificate, and repealing Sections 31 and 32 of Ordinance No. 140 of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the terms hereof, and providing a penalty for its violation.

Be it Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Alliance, Nebraska:

Section 1. That after any sewer connection is made from any sewer main in the City of Alliance, Nebraska, there shall be three inspections as follows:

- The sewer when it is laid and jointed and connected up, and before it is covered over.
- The soil waste and vent pipes in accordance with Section 23 of Ordinance No. 140 of the City of Alliance, Nebraska.
- The whole system of plumbing when completed.

Section 2. That before such inspections or any of them are made, the owner of such premises shall pay to the City Clerk of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, an inspection fee therefor in the sum of \$2.00, and that upon the completion of such inspection of such sewer connection be found to be in accordance with the ordinances of such city, the Water Commissioner shall issue to the owner of such premises a certificate to such effect.

Section 3. That no person shall turn water into any water service pipe until such certificate shall have been issued in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 4. That Section 3 of Ordinance No. 230 of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, entitled "An Ordinance establishing rules and regulations of the system of Water Works of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, regulating and governing the same, establishing water rates and rules and regulations for the governing of water consumers, plumbers, and others, providing for the laying and repairing of water service pipes in said city, and to protect said water works, including pipes, hydrants,

and other apparatus from injury, and providing penalties for the violation of same, and repealing ordinances numbered 33, 44, 74, 75, 98, 141 and sections 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27 and 28, of Ordinance numbered 180 and Section 32 of Ordinance 192 of said City of Alliance, and all other ordinances of said city of Alliance, in conflict herewith," and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions hereof be, and they hereby are repealed.

Section 5. That any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not less than \$10.00 and not more than \$100.00, and shall stand committed to the city jail until such fine and costs are paid in accordance with law.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in accordance with law.

**ORDINANCE NO. 284**

An Ordinance providing for an inspection of water connections in the City of Alliance, Nebraska; providing a certificate of such inspection; providing a fee therefor; repealing section 3 of Ordinance No. 230 of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the terms hereof, and providing penalty for its violation.

Section 1. That after any water connection is made from any water main in the City of Alliance, there shall be an inspection of such connection by the Water Commissioner of such city, or his duly authorized agent.

Section 2. That before such inspections or any of them are made, the owner of such premises shall pay to the City Clerk of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, an inspection fee therefor in the sum of \$2.00 and upon the completion of such inspection if such water connection be found to be in accordance with the ordinances of such city, the Water Commissioner shall issue to the owner of such premises a certificate to such effect.

Section 3. That no person shall turn water into any water service pipe until such certificate shall have been issued in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance.

That Section 3 of Ordinance No. 230 of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, entitled "An Ordinance establishing rules and regulations of the system of Water Works of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, regulating and governing the same, establishing water rates and rules and regulations for the governing of water consumers, plumbers, and others, providing for the laying and repairing of water service pipes in said city, and to protect said water works, including pipes, hydrants,
