ALLIANCE BRIEFS

Mrs. Myrtle Leishman, guardian of her father, James H. Skinner, who was adjudged insane some time ago and who recently died in the state hospital presented her final account, which was audited and approved by Judge Tash in probate court yesterday.

The city council will meet Wednesday evening in adjourned session and a number of matters will come up for disposal, among them the opening of bids for sanitary sewer construction in districts No. 11 and 12. Estimates for the year's expenses will also be made and a levy framed.

William Coleman of Hay Springs and A. D. Shipp of Rushville will be the principal speakers at a meeting to be held at Reddish hall Saturday evening for the purpose of perfecting a non-partisan and labor organization. A special invitation has been

extended to farmers and union men to be present.

A. C. Smith of Smith & Chambers of Scottsbluff, was in the city Saturday, looking over the specifications and preparing to submit a bid on the sewer main contract, which will be awarded by the city council Wednesday evening.

Sheriff Miller made a trip to Scottsbluff Monday and for one time came back without his man. However, he got what he went after. The sheriff went over to the sugar city armed with a warrant for the arrest of William Spurr, who, it was said, had passed a couple of bad checks, aggregating quite a sum on Vaughn & Sons of this city. Mr. Spurr delayed not, but dug up the cash to make his checks good, and the sheriff rode back alone.

Judge L. A. Berry has been on the go for the past two or three weeks, his business taking him to Rushville, Running and other neighboring cities. He will leave this week for Rushville, where district court is in session. At Dunning last week he ran across the state's champion oldest citizen, Pete Starr, who claims to be 103 years old and apparently has records to prove that he was born January 5, 1818. Mr. Starr looks to be not over eighty years of age, his eyesight and hearing are good and he is comparatively active. "HUCKLEBERRY FINN" COMING TO IMPERIAL

A number of good bills are scheduled for the Imperial the next few days, but probably the leading attraction of the lot is an adaptation of Mark Twain's "Huckleberry Finn" which will be shown Thursday.
