ELECTION PROCLAMATION

By the Governor
WHEREAS, a Constitutional Convention called agreeable to law by the people of the State of Nebraska to meet December 2nd, 1919, and whereas the members elected to said Constitutional Convention did so meet and provide that certain pro-

posed amendments to the Constitution be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection, and did further provide that said proposed Constitutional amendments be submitted at a special election to be held throughout the State on Tuesday, the twenty-first day of September, 1920.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Samuel R. McKelvie, Governor of the State of Nebraska, by authority of law in me vested, do hereby direct and proclaim that a special election be held in the several polling places throughout the State of Nebraska on Tuesday, the twenty-first day of September, 1920, during the hours designated by law for holding General Elections for the purpose of adopting or rejecting said proposed amendments.
