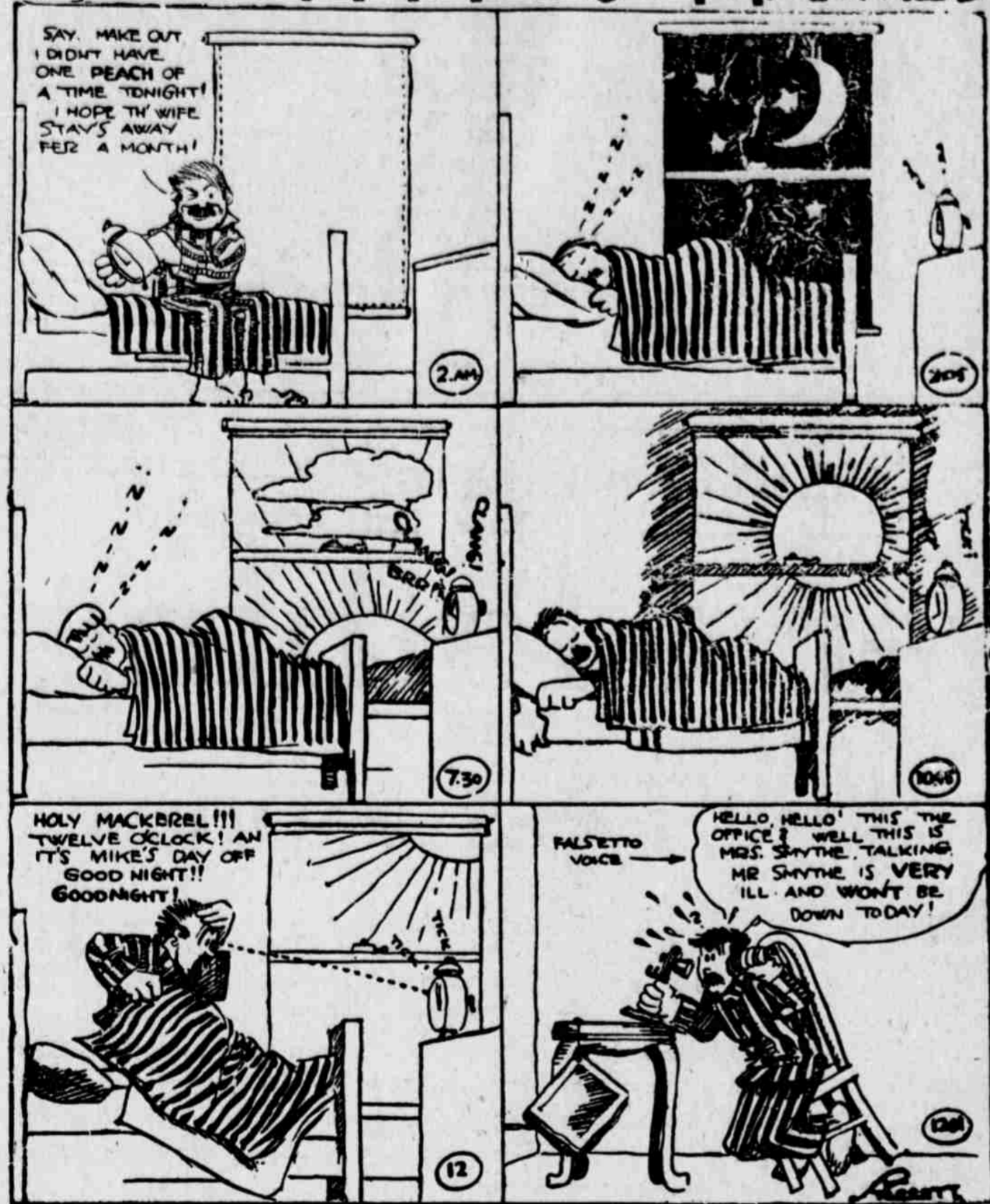

with the provisions of Ordinances No. 262 and No. 266 in the City of Alliance, Nebraska, and supplying any omissions in the same and for finally levying such re-assessments. Such special taxes or re-assessments will be levied and re-assessed on all lots, parts of lots, land, and real estate within said sewer districts to the extent of the special benefit to such lots, parts of lots, land and real estate, by reason of such improvement, such benefits to be determined by the Council sitting as a Board of Equalization, and in cases where the Council sitting as a Board of Equalization shall find such benefits to be equal and uniform, such re-assessments may be according to the feet frontage and may be prorated and scaled back from the line of such improvement according to such rules as the Board of Equalization may consider fair and equitable, and all such re-assessments and findings or benefits shall not be subject to review in any equitable or legal action, except for fraud, injustice or mistake.

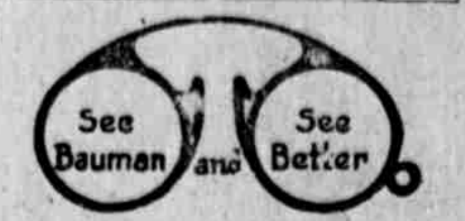
