Anderson of the bureau of crop estimates and Leo Stuhr, secretary of the Nebraska department of agriculture. The total value of all live stock decreased from \$337,020,000 on January 1 last year to \$242,660,000 on the same date this year. The highest value on record is the 1918 total which reached \$425,479,000 or nearly twice terest in the performance. the present value. 
